Learning Through Volunteering

I'm very much a bonsai newcomer, but I've learned a lot of great information in the not-quite-two-years since I joined the Indianapolis Bonsai Club and started studying bonsai. On top of all of the workshops and demos, volunteering at local shows taught me even more about how to create bonsai and showed me how much I already learned.

A lot of volunteering at bonsai shows like the State Fair is answering questions for people, and this can really drive home how much you already know! Most of the questions I could answer on my own: "Is there a specific type of bonsai tree?" or "Do you grow them from seeds in those pots?" Other questions I could answer by glancing at the display tags, but the few times I didn't know, I just asked some experienced members who were happy to fill in the answers for both of us.

I probably learned the most about how to "finish" a tree and put together a display by volunteering at local shows. It's a great chance to ask your own questions about bonsai, not just answering other people's questions. Seeing multiple displays together can really help you figure out what you like, or don't like, or provide inspiration on what to do with that pre-bonsai you have sitting around waiting for inspiration to strike. There are always experienced members there, and they've been happy to talk about the various trees and displays. What's good, what could be improved, or what you could do to achieve a similar effect yourself.

There's even more to learn from volunteering at bigger shows, like this year's MABA. Bigger shows attract more participants, which means even more amazing displays to study. Not only did I learn how to keep the trees and accent plants watered, I got to ask questions of people who know what they were doing and could provide additional commentary on what made the best trees so great.





The October meeting featured a tropical bonsai workshop led by Scott Yelich. The workshop included an overview of proper care of several species, especially indoors over the winter. Attendees were welcome to bring their own trees or purchase a tree to work on.

A few tips for caring for tropicals indoors over winter were: use a humidity tray to keep the air from getting too dry for the plants, choose an appropriate species (some are more forgiving of humidity and light conditions), and provide airflow (e.g. a fan) to help prevent bugs and mildew.


