#### **BONSAI AT THE 2018 INDIANA STATE FAIR**

The Indiana State Fair will span 3 weeks this year and they have requested the Indianapolis Bonsai Club to again assist in the administration of the Bonsai Exhibit and Competition. The IBC has agreed and hopefully there will be participation by bonsai enthusiasts from throughout the state.

There is no question the bonsai have been the hit in the past fairs so for 2018 the Indiana State Fair has requested the bonsai be on display from the Friday the fair opens, Aug 3, through Friday, August 10. Obviously no one wants to exhibit their bonsai in an interior environment for 9 days so there will be two sessions as follows:

#### Session 1 Judged Bonsai

#### **Session 2 Exhibited Bonsai**

The schedule is:

Thursday Aug 2 through 5PM, deliver Bonsai to be set up and judged

Friday Aug 3 through Tuesday Aug 7 or Wednesday August 8, Judged Bonsai on display

Tuesday Aug 7 or Wednesday Aug 8 remove Judged Bonsai and set up Exhibit Bonsai.

. Exhibit Bonsai on display through Friday evening

Saturday Aug 10 remove all bonsai prior to 8am.

The event will be held in the Agricultural / Horticultural Building at the Indiana State Fairgrounds. When the bonsai are delivered they will be registered, labels made and the bonsai can then be set up. There is no entry fee.

We have committed to having a minimum of one volunteer present when the fair is open to the public (8 am – 10pm). Obviously volunteers are needed. The building will be locked when closed and the Indiana State Fair will have someone present in the building all night for security.

Entry form is attached to this memo and we would like them submitted ASAP so we have an idea of how many bonsai will be entered.

Last year we had 3 bonsai vendors participate and all 3 have committed to 2018. The vendors can remain throughout the entire fair.

What is needed now is some idea of how many bonsai will be at the fair. Numbers are all that is needed now. We are also requesting volunteer names. A schedule will be prepared later. #### From the President

July was a busy month for the club 50th anniversary celebration and an outdoor meeting.

Participation in the 50th anniversary was great. Holiday Park proved to be am excellent choice for the gathering. [Thank you Scott]. We had 48 bonsai displays by 11members. There were 187 visitors, but it was never overly crowded. The diversity of trees gave a fine representation of the club. The buffet lunches was tasty and members had time to 'catch up' with one another. The only 'downer' was that the event planner, Dan Cain, had a fall and could not attend. The feedback from Holiday Park's staff was good and there may be opportunities for future shows.

CLUB MEETING: The club meeting was on Wed. July 11, and held outside. Mark, Scott and I provided many Kusamono pots and ample plant material for the workshop. In the instructional portion of the meeting was the difference between Accent plants [also called Shitatusa] and Kusamono. Accent plants are used to enhance or complete the Bonsai composition. They should be plants that grow in the same environment as the tree and be in the same 'seasonal' development. The pots should be different ie. glazed vs. unglazed, oval vs. square, etc. than the tree. The most important factor is that the Accent plant must complement the tree and not be the central attraction.

Kusamono is a separate plant; perhaps with a very small tree. They have been called "Nature in Miniature". These displays have showy pots with an occasional flower etc. The composition of material should be from the same environmental area and complimentary. The American Bonsai Society has a good pamphlet by Pauline Muth on the topic

AUGUST MEETING. The August meeting will focus on how to prepare a bonsai display. There are experienced members who have received several 'ribbons' at past shows. These trees will be displayed in a separate area. I have asked that these trees be presented at the meeting and give some history on their development. The meeting will also try to help members, that are showing trees, on last minute details before presentation. If you have ever been at the preparation day at a big convention, you will see bonsai participants doing last minute work like moss application and cleaning. The position of the accent plant, placing the tree on the stand, and other preparations bring out the best in the tree and owner. I will try to find moss for members are showing trees, but I can not predict the weather.

SEPTEMBER MEETING: It is not too early to be looking through your collection and deciding what you need or may want to auction off!.
