By then it may be too late to order that specific pot you want or find the soil components you need. Now is the time to plan ahead. Be Prepared.

Speaking of soils, The February IBC meeting presentation is on Bonsai Soils. WAIT..STOP..I can read your mind! You are thinking "My bonsai are alive and seem to be doing OK. Why should I attend this meeting?" A number of years ago we had Warren Hill (Former Curator of the National Bonsai Collection) present a soils program and he speculated around 25% of the bonsai thrived due to their soil composition and the other 75% survived in spite of the soil they were planted in and yet 100% of the bonsai enthusiasts strongly believed and would defend to the end they had the perfect soil. Hopefully your bonsai are in the thriving 25% class but just to make sure I recommend you attend the February meeting. We have samples of over 50 soil ingredients to view and discuss as well as some enlightening experiments to help you choose the correct soil mixture for your bonsai environment.

February Bonsai Care

(suggestions/considerations)

Indoor

Watering: Maintain moisture.

Fertilizing: Do not fertilize.

Pruning: Maples may be pruned if w/out leaves.

Potting: Do not repot.

Wiring: Only wire conifers and evergreens.

Outdoor

Location: Protect all trees from cold weather.

Watering: Keep soil moist and mist twice a week.

Fertilizing: Do not fertilize.

Pruning: Do not prune.

Potting: You may begin repotting.

Wiring: Ideal time to wire.
