

From the Vice President

ello Indy Bonsai Club members. Paul is taking a break this month, so I've been enlisted to do the monthly message. In case you haven't noticed, it's really hot outside right now. Our trees react to this heat about the same way we do as people. Many of them would like some afternoon shade, and all of them need extra water.

Some of my trees really love the heat. Many of my ficus trees and bougainvillea love being out in the blaing sun and they're growing like weeds. Other trees, like my maples, parrot's beaks and schefflera really don't like baking in the sun. Although these trees don't mind the morning sun, they really need some additional protection from the afternoon heat. I've repositioned these types of trees to areas of my garden than get morning sun, but afternoon shade from either the side of the house or one of the trees in my yard. All of my trees are drinking more water right now. With a streak of several days above 90F, I've been watering 2-3 times a day.

I'm sure that most of you are aware that the Indiana State Fair is right around the corner. Once again, there will be a judged bonsai display in the Agriculture/Horticulture Building during the first week of the fair. Once again, ribbons will be awarded based on years of experience and type of tree. We'll have classes for Youth, Novice, Intermediate and Open, furthermore, varieties of trees including tropical, deciduous, evergreen and indigenous to Indiana. The state fair display will also be broken into two sessions. Session One will run from Friday, August 2nd through Tuesday, August 6th. This session will be judged and ribbons will be awarded. The second session will run from Wednesday, August 7 until tear-down time, which normally happens around 7am Saturday morning. The second session is display only. No awards will be given. Since the building is fairly cool and the lighting dim, I would highly recommend NOT keeping a tree on display through both sessions. It will stress your tree.

As usual, we can always use extra help for the setup, which will be on Thursday, August 1st. We'll also need help manning the booth while the trees are on display. The building is open from 9AM - 9PM every day, and we really need someone out there while the building is open to visitors. Our volunteers are in charge of watering the trees and answering questions. (Don't worry! We get asked the same common questions over and over again!) Please talk to Steve Dick, our volunteer coordinator. He'll be happy to add you onto his volunteer schedule.

Finally, Let's talk a little about the upcoming August meeting. During our next meeting, you are invited to bring in a tree for a non-critical critique. I'm sorry to say, but neither Gordon Ramsay or Simon Cowell were available to conduct this critique for us. Instead, we'll have to rely on friendly senior members of the Indianapolis Bonsai Club for this. First of all, you have to understand that your tree is on a journey. It is always in a state of change. In a positive critique, we aren't looking for an opportunity to tell you what's bad. Rather, we are looking at a tree and reinforcing the positive attributes, while also making suggestions on ways to make your tree even better. I've been at this for a long time. I can still always find ways to make my best trees even better. At the end of the day, a critique is still really just somebody else's suggestions. You may agree with a suggestion or you may wish to follow your own path. It's *your* tree! There are no bonsai police that are going to take your tree if you disagree with their advice. I look forward to seeing you at our August 7th meeting.
