## **Getting Back To Nature**

was in my greenhouse with a customer over the weekend, and my large Brazilian Rain Tree caught his eye. As he gazed at the tree, he commented, "It's beautiful! It looks so......natural!" I joked that it takes a lot of work to make it look so natural. Still, his compliment left an impression on me and it got me thinking. People find natural things pleasing to the eye. We are often distracted by things that look fake. Although we work really hard to maintain our trees, it's still their natural beauty that people tend to find attractive. Natural looking trees remind people of their favorite places. A bonsai can bring to mind a favorite tree in a park or scenic walk in the woods.

Although this article has been written for the November newsletter, it's currently mid October. My tropical trees have been in the greenhouse for a little over a week. It will probably be a month or so before I need to winterize the rest of my bonsai collection. I've been cleaning and wiring some pines this week, but business tends to be a little slower in the fall than in the summer. It's time to go and seek some inspiration. It's time for a walk in the woods.

The weather is great and the leaves are turning color. I guess it's ok to take a little hike....especially if I can tell myself that it's work related! If you have access to property where you can legally collect trees, now is a great time to look for material. Although you shouldn't be digging anything up right now, it's a great time to find material and mark it so it can collected in the Spring. Since we often collect trees just before bud burst, we can't always tell what species we are collecting. You don't want to be the guy who accidently collects poison ivy, do you? Even if you are at a place where you can't collect trees, you can always collect inspiration. I often see trees in nature that inspire me to create similar images as bonsai. I look for trees clinging onto river banks, where the water has washed out much of the soil. I look for trees clinging on the sides of hills. I look for trees twisted by the wind and trees damaged by animals. I look for trees that tell a story, then I try to retell that story as a bonsai. When I'm hiking, I often take pictures of trees that I find interesting. There's no better time to appreciate trees than now, when they are showing off their fall colors.

I encourage all of you to get outside and enjoy the fall. Take a walk in the woods or your local park and look at the trees. It's good for your health and you can gain some inspiration along the way. Here are some pictures of some trees I've seen while hiking, along with a couple of bonsai trees that were inspired by my nature walks. I hope you enjoy them. I look forward to seeing you at the November meeting.

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
