From the President

e are going to have a meeting, well, sort of. Carl keeps telling me if we do not have a some kind of get together soon members will forget about bonsai. I find that impossible but then I have had a few say I am way to obsessed with bonsai, so we are having a quasi meeting. Our schedule calls for a Tropical workshop and we missed the IBC Members sale in June so we are combining the two with certain limitations. There will be no Business discussion prior to the main event. Don't worry about our financial status as last time I checked the Cruise Lines have not resumed operations so our treasurer has not been able to book his "around the world trip" and the IBC funds are safe.

Garfield Park Staff has strongly urged we meet somewhere besides the conservatory, like outside, so they have reserved the covered picnic pavillion for us (for the next 3 months, just in case). We have used this pavillion before and it has 7 – 8ft picnic tables plus space to maintain the recommended 6ft spacing. The pavillion is located in the Northwest corner of the park. We are requesting all present to wear a mask.

The members sale will be from 7 to 7:30pm with the workshop beginning afterward. Any IBC member may bring any bonsai related item(s) to sell and each seller will handle their own transaction. The IBC takes no cut of the sales.

We have 24 fantastic trees for the workshop and for the miniscule expenditure of \$50 you may choose one tree, one pot and soil, wire and drainage mesh. Scott Yelich and I usually go to Florida each year to find workshop material but this year I decided not to go due to the pandemic so Scott went alone and came back with better material than we have had before. We may send Scott alone in the future. I mention this now as Scott has a conflict and will not be at the workshop and someone has already asked "is the material that bad?". We have 4 species available and 3 of them have trunk diameters in excess of 1 ½". I kid you not! These are Dwarf Jade, Ficus and Nea buxifolia. The 4th selection are Rain Trees with a height of 18"-24" and already look good enough to exhibit.

As many of us are concerned about socializing and maintaining adequate spacing we are offering the option to purchase a tree, pot, soil, etc. and taking it home to work on.

I hope to see you but will not shake your hand and I will definitely understand if you stand aside and choose a tree and leave.

Tropical Bonsai Workshop

After several months of canceled meetings due to the current COVID-19 situation, it will be great to get back to our regularly scheduled meetings, even though they will be in a picnic shelter the next few months rather than in the Garfield Park Conservatory Conference Room. The fresh air is good for us!

This month, our attention will be turning towards the tropical bonsai. Generally, this is about the best time of the year to work on this kind of material. I also particularly enjoy working with tropical trees because we can safely perform multiple tasks at once. For most tropical bonsai, we can prune, root prune, trim, wire and re-pot our trees all at the same time. For many of the trees that remain outdoors all year, there is a stricter limit of what we can do during a season. Many tropical trees can handle a lot of work at once during their active growing season.

The upcoming tropical bonsai workshop is sure to be a lot of fun. We have some great material available. During my last trip to Florida, I was able to find some nice Nia Buxifolia, Green Island Ficus and Dwarf African Jade. As an added bonus, I managed to find some Thornless Brazilian Rain Trees. I guess that means the we should be able to leave the bandage box at home! No matter what species of tree you choose for this workshop, you're sure to go home with a great new bonsai.

The workshop trees are in 10 inch bulb pots, and we'll be potting them into 10 inch ceramic bonsai containers. This is a members only workshop and the cost will be \$50 per workshop. The workshop also includes the tree, the pot, wire and drain mesh. You're going to get a lot of tree for the money. If you aren't already a member and you'd like to participate, you can purchase an annual membership that night for the low price of \$25 per year.

It's been a rough spring and I know that people are really looking forward to getting together. I am expecting great attendance for the July meeting. I don't think you'll be disappointed.
