From the President

ummer has pretty well slipped past us and we are nearing fall. The kids are back in school and those overnight temperature lows are getting cooler. I won't miss the string of 90F + days that we had earlier this year. Before I touch on the September meeting, I want do discuss the bonsai show at the Indiana State Fair. In the past, I've normally been leaning on people to bring in material for the show. This year, I was asking people to limit their entries. Furthermore, this year was the first time the State Fair Show was exhibition only. No ribbons were awarded. If you weren't aware, there are several buildings under construction and renovation at the Indiana State Fairgrounds. Because of this, many displays were cut back and many were moved into other buildings. So rather than a building filled with produce, flowers and other horticultural displays, the Agriculture and Horticulture Building was full of things like hot tubs, replacement windows, and flagpoles. There were a few familiar faces in the building, like the bee keepers, the Christmas tree growers and the gourd society, but most of us had much less space than we were ordinarily granted. When we walked in to the building for set up on Thursday morning, we originally had only a 15ft. by 10ft. space marked off for the bonsai trees. With a little luck (and some gracious neighbors) we were able to stretch things out to 40ft. by 10ft. We were then able to put on a decent show. even though we were working with less space that usual. We were able to show roughly 15-18 trees per session, and we still had room for a couple of sales tables. Thank you to all who volunteered to show trees and help out at the State Fair. A special thanks goes out to Steve Dick, who was there every day from open to close. I'm hoping that things will be back to normal for next year's fair. We will keep you posted. Much of it will depend on whether or not all the renovations will be completed by next year's State Fair.

Our September meeting is usually one of the best attended meetings of the year. As usual, it's the annual club auction and people love a chance at coming home with new stuff for a reasonable price. You must be a current club member to participate in the auction. If you are interested in selling, you are free to bring any trees, pots, tools or bonsai related items to go up on the auction block. The live auctions are "no reserve" auctions and the club keeps 20% of the sale. If you wish to set a reserve on items, you can do so during a silent auction, which goes on throughout the live auction. The silent auction normally closes about 15 minutes before the end of the live auction. If you want to buy, the club gladly accepts cash, check or credit cards. If you have a lot of small items for sale, we recommend selling your items together in lots. For example, if you have 12 small pots, you should group them into 3 lots with 4 pots each to save time. Auctions forms will be attached to both this newsletter and on the website. Please have your forms filled out at ready to go before coming to the meeting.

As a reminder to some and a warning to others: There is no business meeting before the auction. We start fast. We recommend that you arrive early so you can be prepared. You will need to go to the membership desk first to get a number if you wish to buy or sell at the auction. If you are selling, print your auction forms at home and have them ready! I look forward to seeing you at the next meeting. I'll be getting out of the way fast so the auctioneers can do their thing.

Once again the IBC had a successful State Fair. With the Hog Barn under reconstruction, it forced the Expo Hall vendors to invade the Ag-Hort Building, but we survived. We were originally allocated only a 10x15 foot space, but we finagled to get 10x40 feet allowing us to display 15 trees and a Suiseki display each half of the show, and have space for sales. Many loyal visitors, both young and old, said it was a challenge to find us but were very happy something Ag-Hort was even in the building. Over the 8 days of our fair, thousands visited our booth. Unfortunately, only 7 members displayed trees. Sales were good for trees, soil, and drip trays, earning the club not only the fair's fee for our display but also a decent profit for the club. 
