#### Deciduous Bonsai April 5, 2023



A deciduous Bonsai tree is one that sheds its leaves in the Fall (Autumn) months to go into its dormant period over Winter. Popular types of deciduous Bonsai include Maple, Elm, American Beech, Hophornbeam, Chinese Elm & and Wisteria varieties. The best soil mix for deciduous Bonsai trees will contain more clay based substrate (such as Akadama) to aid in water retention.

The best time for potting many of these trees is when the buds are just starting to swell. This workshop will include a tree growing in a one or two gallon pot,, an eight inch ceramic pot, soil, wire and drain mesh. We will have a nice variety of trees available which will likely include species like, ginkgo, trident maple, Japanese maple, amur maple, Chinese elm, American beech and American hornbeam. The board is still in the process of determining the cost of this workshop, but I can assure you that it will be very affordable.
